


## What needles should I use



Any craft can be overwhelming to start with, and you can sometimes feel like you need buy a lot of equipment when you are starting out, which is not the case!




Generally people thi that wooden needle are easier to learn (because they are le slippery, but they are more prone to breaking. I think it useful to get used metal and plastic to

Using a thin ply with large needles creates a loose, meshy weave, or using tiny needles creates a tight, structured weave. It all depends what you are going for, so play around and create some swatches!

cast on using the knit cast on technique

tart off by creating a slip knot on your pointer finger, and slip it on to the needle, pulling to tighten.

ass the needle in the right hand through the loop on the left needle and bring the right needle under the


Vith your left hand, wrap the working yarn around your left hand needle.


ring the right needle back through the loop on the left needle.
