APPRAISAL DEFINITION – This is when we critically assess the value or quality of something.

1. DESCRIBE	Key details – artist name, artwork name, materials, size, etc.
	Describe overall – general appearance
	Describe details – techniques used to create, features observed on closer examination
2. ANALYSE	Identify Elements & Principles (identify around 3 Elements and one Principle). Refer to definitions sheet to help you use the key terms.
