Re: Year 7 Outdoor Education Camp 2025

Dear Parents and students of year 7,

The year 7 Outdoor Education program is held early term 1. To assist you in getting organised, some preliminary program and packing information is given below. Further details will be provided when school returns in late January.

The year 7 Outdoor Education program is held at the College's own property - Camp Ibis, on the Banksia Peninsula in the Gippsland Lakes area on Gunai-Kurnai Country. This Outdoor Education program is an integral part of the school curriculum for students' personal development.

The program for the week is carefully structured to teach students a variety of outdoor skills, in a number of fun activities that may include: bush and beach walking, orienteering, adventure racing / obstacle courses, sailing, stand up paddle boarding, canoeing, bush cooking, camping and mountain biking. Whilst undertaking these activities students will also be learning about the local environment and history. Throughout the week students will be challenged in various ways, taking on leadership roles, being an active team member, solving problems, taking on responsibilities and showing independence; all the while having a great time and sharing much fun and laughter with their Mentor teacher and peers.

All camps will depart from South Rd gates at 8.30am on the Monday morning. All camps will return to South Rd gates at 4.30pm on the Friday afternoon. We will advise which classes are going on which exact camp when school starts in late January.

## **CLOTHING / EQUIPMENT**

Students should be well prepared for an exciting week of activities. Preparation and packing are worthwhile learning experiences for the students although it would be appreciated if you could supervise and help if needed. Your child should carefully check off the equipment against the attached list provided and pack it, ensuring their ability to repack each day while on camp.

The clothing and equipment list is attached. To make this as simple as possible, we have set up two options for you to purchase and / or hire your gear. You can choose to purchase or hire equipment as required (if you do not already own suitable items). To ensure the equipment meets our requirements and safety standards, OED staff have selected an approved range of specific items that families can choose from, to best suit their child and budget.
